Dermatology Services – engagement opportunity

Have you been diagnosed and/or been treated for skin cancer? Do you, or does a member of your family have a long term skin condition like psoriasis or eczema?. Do you regularly attend a hospital for your dermatology appointments or have you used dermatology services recently? NHS health commissioners are reviewing local Dermatology services to understand how services can continue to be delivered and improved over the next five years. In addition to engaging with relevant patient support organisations, commissioners are keen to hear from those in our community, who have an interest in or experience of using these services, as well as their friends and families. We are planning to hold a number of engagement opportunities in April and May and are keen to hear from you and to hear your views.

We are particularly keen to hear from people who would be interested in working closely with the commissioning team to support our patient and public engagement work as well as supporting discussions with the clinical teams who currently deliver dermatology services. There is also the opportunity to be involved in the procurement of new services. Your support would be appreciated from April 2018 for up to a year but we would be happy to tailor this to suit your circumstances. Is it 'private fostering'? Know your responsibilities

Are you aware of a child who has been living with someone who is NOT a close relative (e.g. a parent, sibling, grandparent, uncle or aunt) for 28 days or more?. If the child involved is under 16 (or 18 if disabled), there is a legal duty to inform your local authority about such an arrangement. This is so that we can provide advice and information to the carer and ensure the child or young person is being well cared for.
